Waste Stream Discharge Permit

Specific Permit Conditions

VIOLATION OF ANY OF THESE PERMIT CONDITIONS MAY RESULT IN THE SUSPENSION OR

REVOCATION OF THE PERMITTEE'S DISCHARGE PRIVILEGES

- 1. Permittee is required to schedule and participate in an orientation prior to commencing any discharge at the WWTP and Permittee shall require any Haulers operating pursuant to this Discharge Permit to attend such orientation.
- 2. Permittee shall allow the WWTP personnel, or its authorized representative upon presentation of credentials to:
 - a. Enter Permittee's premises where a regulated activity is located or conducted, or where records must be kept in accordance with the conditions of this Discharge Permit; and
 - b. Have access to and copy, at reasonable times, any records that must be kept under the conditions of this Discharge Permit; and
 - c. Inspect at reasonable times any facilities, equipment, including monitoring and control equipment, practices, or operations regulated or required under this Discharge Permit; and
 - d. Sample or monitor, for purposes of assuring Discharge Permit compliance, any substance or parameters at any location.
- 3. Permittee and its licensed Hauler ("Permittee/Hauler") which shall include the driver, shall adhere to the following unloading procedure at the WWTP:
 - a. Upon arrival at the WWTP, Permittee/ Hauler shall check in at the WWTP Office.
 - b. The On-Duty Clerk will oversee the Hauler's entry of information on the Hauler Manifest or into the automatic receiving station control panel, where the date, time of arrival, vehicle/ truck ID number, and gallons to discharge are recorded. Failure by the Hauler to accurately complete the Hauler Record Form may result in loss of unloading privileges.
 - c. Hauler may be required to obtain an empty sample bottle from the On-Duty Clerk, label the bottle with name, date and time and proceed to designated unloading area.
 - d. WWTP personnel may perform an audit, which involves inspecting the load during delivery for verification of volume and content of discharge. Verification of Vehicle/Truck identification number and Hauler's signature may be required. Discrepancies from volume or any other information provided on Hauler Record Form may result in loss of discharge privileges.
 - e. After completion of discharge, Permittee/Hauler shall hose off the back of the truck in the designated receiving area, as necessary, to reduce unsanitary conditions.
 - f. A full, properly labeled sample bottle may be required to be taken to the WWTP laboratory for analysis.

- 4. A WWTP representative may request of Permittee/Hauler information concerning the origin, and nature of the contents of any registered vehicle and Permittee/Hauler shall comply with all information requests concerning the load. This may include but is not limited to pick up points, volumes, and wastewater characteristics.
- 5. Permittee/Hauler shall take care when connecting or disconnecting or unloading to prevent the spillage of any materials around the hauled wastewater acceptance station of the WWTP. It shall be the sole responsibility of Permittee/Hauler and its employees and subcontractors to leave the WWTP acceptance station in a satisfactory condition.
- 6. No Hauled waste loads shall be discharged without the use of a hose. All vehicles discharging at the WWTP shall use the hose size designated by the WWTP personnel, depending on but not limited to the type of waste to be unloaded and location of discharge. Any special hose or adapters shall be the responsibility of Permittee/Hauler.
- 7. Permittee/Hauler acknowledges that WWTP may use video cameras or other such equipment to monitor discharge activities and to ensure compliance with this Discharge Permit.
- 8. The original Discharge Permit shall be kept in the Permittee's office and each registered hauling vehicle/truck shall carry a copy of the Discharge Permit at all times. A WWTP representative may request to see the Discharge Permit at any time.
- 9. This Discharge Permit shall be valid ONLY WHEN ALL OTHER FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL PERMITS REQUIRED BY THE PERMITTEE/HAULER FOR TRANSPORTING WASTEWATERS ARE VALID AND CURRENT.
